

During the week the students of Goomalling Primary School had to complete the SEW (Social Emotional Wellbeing) Student Survey. This lead to a class converstation about what we love about our school. It was a beautiful autumn day so following their lead we went on an advenutre walk to collect some items to look at using our new classroom microscope. This lead to lots of rich conversation about the range of items we found. Lara and Tayla found leaves and plants to look at, Maddisyn found a feather that had a lot more in it than first met the eye, Abbey found some beautiful purple glass, Ebony found an interesting white rock, Ben and Hunter discovered some lovely quartz and Hope's dandelion gave us all a shock when we discovered a stowaway bug not visible to the naked eye!

This term in Design and Technology the year 3 & 4 students have been investigating engineering principles and systems, with a focus on bridge structures.

The task had students research different bridge types [beam and truss bridges, arch bridges and suspension bridges], and then plan and design a bridge using a range of recycled materials.

The building activity was a huge success and allowed students to research and collaborate their ideas in the initial phase of lessons. The students began building, allowing for a few changes to the first design as they progressed. Finally this week, filled with anticipation, we moved to the testing stage.

The test for the bridges was to see if they could withstand the applied force of weight in grams and kilograms on the structure and reflect on the outcome.

The bridges that had been built blew me away with the creativity and the hard work. Well done students on outstanding engineering and building!



Year 5/6 Happenings

We have had our noses to the grind over the last few weeks, making the most of the term. During our literacy block we have been focussing on Syntax, Morphology and Oral Reading Fluency.

<u>What is Syntax?</u>

"Syntax is the arrangement of words and phrases to create well-formed sentences. We need vocabulary to discuss syntax. In other words, we use terminology to facilitate our work in writing and reading."

The late William Van Cleave, 2020.

What is Morphology?

"As students' syllable recognition and spelling progress, teachers can emphasize morphemes — prefixes, bases and suffixes, mostly from Latin and Greek" (Henry 1997).

Beginning with inflections that may change the spelling of a base word, students analyse words into units that often link meaning and spelling." Dr. Louisa Moates

What is Oral Reading Fluency?

Reading fluency is how quickly, accurately, automatically and expressively someone reads. It means that a child can recognize and decode words accurately and automatically and understand the words as they are being read.

Fluent Readers

- Read quickly
- Read words automatically
- Pause at punctuation marks
- Sound like they are speaking
- Read with appropriate intonation

Non-Fluent Readers

- Read slowly and laboriously
- Read word by word
- Do not pause at punctuation marks and read through sentences
- Sound choppy
- Read in a monotone voice
