2024 – 2026 Strategic Plan

We are in the final stages of building our 2024 – 2026 Strategic Plan, and are holding our final community meeting this evening at the school. The students, staff and School Council have contributed to this planning since last year, and we are looking forward to finalising our plan by the end of this term.

Data Collection

We have been busy at school collecting our baseline data from the beginning of the year. We have completed DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) testing across the school, the Pre-primary to Grade 2 students have completed On-Entry Testing, NAPLAN is coming up in Week 8 for our Grades 3 and 5 students, Sounds-Write diagnostic testing has been completed, and our classroom teachers have been busy collecting other relevant data that aligns with their classroom programs and our whole school programs. The intention behind this is to collect relevant data, analyse it, and then respond to the data by adjusting our planning in the classroom. This ensures that every student's needs are being met as optimally as possible.

School Pick Up

Please ensure that students are picked up from school on time. Kindy and Pre-Primary students need a parent/guardian to collect them from the classroom.From Grade 1, students are dismissed when the siren rings at 3:00pm. Please let the office know if there are any changes to your pick-up arrangements.

At the request of our parent community, assemblies will now be held at 9:00am. This allows families to bring their children to school and stay for the duration of the assembly.


AN ARTIST IN OUR MIDST!






ESCAPE WITH US TO NARNIA

Welcome to the new school year. My name is Georgia Falconer and I am the Community Health Nurse who visits your school

Community Health Nurses work in schools to promote healthy development and wellbeing, so students can reach their full potential.

A major part of our work is focused on the School Entry Health Assessment and implementing the School Based Immunisation Program.

We cover a large area across the Avon and Central Wheatbelt, so you will not see us in the schools every day, however we can also be contacted by phone.

Medical conditions

The school should be aware of any medical conditions, allergies, medication needs or changes in your child's health status. Your current address and telephone details are essential, so the school can care for your child appropriately and contact you should the need arise. If your child requires medication or treatment, including an Epipen, you must notify the school/classroom teacher, so that a health care or action plan can be put in place. This should be updated annually and signed by your Doctor.

The beginning of each term is a good opportunity to ensure that your child's school emergency medication (asthma reliever or Epipen) has not expired.

Kindy Screening

All children in Western Australia are offered a School Entry Health Assessment (SEHA) during their first year of primary school. We can also offer the SEHA to pre-primary and year 1 students who have not been assessed previously.

The SEHA includes a vision, hearing, height/weight, dental and general health check. Referral to the appropriate health service can be arranged if there any concerns. If you receive a health assessment form, please sign giving your consent and return to school ASAP.

Targeted Screening

Any concerns about your child's vision, hearing, speech, movement, behaviour, development, growth or weight can be investigated, with referral to the appropriate health service if required.Please discuss these concerns with your child's teacher or myself.

Immunisation

Current immunisation status is a requirement for school entry. If your child has not had their immunisations, please make an appointment with your GP or Child Health Service. Any child that is not fully immunised can be excluded from school for a period of up to 2 weeks during a disease outbreak. To get an updated AIR IMMUNISATION History statement either log into Medicare via (my.gov.au) or ring 1800653809.

Health Promotion

I can provide the school community with information relating to Health, including growth and development, healthy eating, physical activity, weight management, hand washing, asthma, anaphylaxis and parenting resources.

KIDSPORT We are a Kidsport eligible club. Eligible children can use their \$150 kidsport voucher towards all registration fees.


Events: The club joins the Avon Association to participate in Club championships in Perth and/or any eligible competition.
